Dealing with Mistreatment

uch of the bible is spent teaching mankind how to get along. In fact, half of the ten commandments deal with man's relationship with his fellow man. We should go to great lengths to ensure we treat one another correctly. But what about when someone mistreats us? It happens. It's bound to happen. Sometimes, we are mistreated by those who we love most dearly. It is at those times we must be extra cautious in our response and reaction. The scriptures give us guidelines to lead us through those situations to give us the best chance at a positive outcome.

When I look at the example of Jesus these principles become so apparent. The first one is taken from His great sermon on the mount. Matthew 5:38-42 contains Jesus' teachings about retaliation. This stands in stark contrast with the "eye for an eye" mentality that His audience had. He teaches us that when one mistreats us, we should not be consumed with anger and vengeance. Rather, we should respond in humility and gentleness. This is very foreign to many of us. Yet, if we prize our relationships with one another we will strive to practice this great teaching.

At the end of the life of Christ we see two other principles illustrated. As Jesus was hanging on the cross, He said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34, ESV). Notice to whom Jesus is speaking "Father". During this atrocity Jesus prayed. Not only did He pray, He prayed for the very ones that were murdering Him. How often do we pray for the ones that mistreat us? It is not a natural thing to do. But, in my experience, it is very difficult to remain angry or upset with someone for whom you are praying.

As we examine continue to Jesus' prayer we realize that He was entreating the Father for their forgiveness. This is the last principle we will note. When someone mistreats us we should always respond to them with a willingness to forgive. Again, this not an easy task but it is not impossible to develop this attitude. Two other men come to mind to show us this was not a supernatural ability that only Jesus possessed. Stephen made an identical statement when he was being stoned (Acts 7:60). Paul, likewise said something similar when he had been abandoned (2 Timothy 4:16).
