Three Words for Growth in 2025 –Part 2

he first word we looked at in this series on church growth was **compassion**...sympathy, pity and concern for others. Jesus modeled this throughout His ministry. We should as well.

Imitation is a word I think of when I consider church growth. Imitation is the act of using something or someone as a model. Paul imitated Christ according I Corinthians 11:1. The scriptures teach we should also.

As Peter discusses Christ's willingness to suffer for us, he reminds us that *Christ was our example* and that *we should follow in His steps* (I Peter 2:21). In John 15:9-11, Jesus teaches His disciples to love as He loves and to obey God's commandments just as He has.

Jesus loved to teach. After all, His mission was to seek and to save the lost (Lk 19:10). This cannot be done by example only; we have to open our mouths and share the gospel. Penn Jillette, one half of Penn and Teller who perform magic and comedy in Las Vegas is an Atheist. He asked, "How much do you have to hate somebody to not proselytize?" "How much do you have to hate somebody to believe that everlasting life is possible and not tell them that? If I believed beyond a shadow of a doubt that a truck was coming at you and you didn't believe it, and that truck was bearing down on you, there's a certain point where I tackle you. And this is more important than that." I am certainly not saying we should imitate an Atheist, but in this case, he speaks truth.

Paul said *be imitators of God as dear children* (Eph 5:1). When my grandson, August is with me, he follows me wherever I go, even repeats—*imitates*—the things I say and do. He wants to be like me; he wants to be with me and do the things I do. And by-the-way, I love it!

Christ was all about teaching others and doing good. You might recall when He taught the lawyer, a Pharisee in <u>Matthew 23:39</u>, He said, *thou shall love thy neighbor as thyself*. Jesus exemplified this again and again and in <u>Matthew 15</u>, he feeds more than 4,000. He taught them and fed them. Why? <u>In verse 32</u>, He said, *I have compassion on the multitude*.
