slide. He always wanted to remind people of the things that were truly important in this life. Luke 10:38-42 records such an instance. This passage reads, "Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a village. And a woman named Martha welcomed him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to his teaching. But Martha was distracted with much serving. And she went up to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Tell her then to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many

esus never missed an opportunity to teach someone. He never let things

things, but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her." (ESV)

We immediately see a contrast between the sisters. One was busy serving, which under normal circumstances is a commendable endeavor. However, these were not normal circumstances. The Savior was present, and he was teaching those in the house. The other sister recognized the incredible situation in which she found herself and instead of following cultural norms sat to listen to Jesus' message.

This contrast did not go unnoticed by Martha either. She goes to Jesus to ask Him to demand that Mary help her. I wonder, did she interrupt Jesus' teaching to ask this question? In the Arabic, Ethiopic and Latin Vulgate versions it says "she stood and said" implying that she had no intention to stay and listen but would shortly leave after asking her question. It also appears that she did not speak to Mary directly but went straight to Jesus. Noble as her intentions may be to be a good host, in this moment they were misdirected.

This is what Jesus points out to her in His response. He informs Martha that she is anxious and worried about so many things but none of them mattered. Only one thing, Jesus says, is necessary; that is hearing the gospel preached. Mary, in this moment, understood that. She chose what was most important of all.

We often end up doing exactly as Martha. We have so many things in our life that seem to be incredibly important. They often distract us from what truly matters. Which portion will we choose?
